"Being in the Narcotics Crime Investigation Department (NCID), I am at war against drugs and drug lords on a daily basis. I want a drug-free country for future generations and help those who succumbed to this addiction.

"I try to understand and help drug abusers to deal with addiction – putting them behind bars would be my last option. They need help more than anyone else," he said.

As much as he is driven to eradicate drugs from the country and punish the abusers for ruining many lives, Thiven still finds putting the perpetrators behind bars heart-wrenching.

"The day one of the suspects in my first high-profile case got sentenced to life imprisonment for drug trafficking, I had to admit I was very sad and broken when I saw his single mother together with other members of his family crying outside Kuching High Court as the suspect was taken away.

"I felt somewhat guilty at that moment even though I knew I did the right thing," he said.

However, it is surely a remarkably life-changing career for Thiven who is thriving with many accomplishments.

He reminisces fond memories at his alma mater and thinks it is only



I can quite frankly say that FiS lecturers differ from other institutions by their passion and the fact that they truly want you to succeed. Another thing I really like about FiS is the opportunity to pick our electives in the final semester. I chose Chemistry III and Biosciences.

I recently just started undergraduate medicine at IMU and Biosciences has helped me adapt to a significant part of my medical degree. Biosciences was not easy but I'm glad I did it because it made my life in undergraduate medicine much easier.

With the Covid-19 pandemic today, I feel it would be relevant to discuss online learning.

My FiS cohort received the short end of the stick when the first lock-down was imposed – we were two weeks away from our final exam in our second semester. For a while, everyone was scrambling, but eventually, we got back on track when the online learning system was up and running.

At IMU, online classes are conducted via Microsoft Teams.

In some instances, lecturers pre-record a lecture and upload the recording for students to watch

at a time that suits their schedule. Live sessions are also held for students to clarify any doubts.

I found that once you get used to learning online, it opens the door to unlimited opportunities depending on whether you know how to use it or not.

For example, I once attended an important lecture on the way back from a doctor's appointment.
Online learning made it possible for me to be in two 'places' at once. I could study at a time that suited my schedule, which freed up a significant part of my timetable.

Although I personally prefer physical classes, being able to do my course online has allowed me to explore many of my other interests since I no longer need to allocate travel time and having to physically be at a certain location.

This allowed me to dive deeper into my passion in research and entrepreneurship, which I've continued to pursue even after FiS. Currently, I'm working with my mentors on building a start-up that makes biodegradable packaging from rice straw.

Right now, I am confident to say that I am thriving in undergraduate medicine. To my many mentors in the FiS faculty – without all of you, I would not have had the courage to pursue my many dreams."



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
