First runner-up for forest fashion

MANAGEMENT and Science University (MSU) student Muhammad Danish Saiful Rizal bagged second place in the Alam Flora Waste Is Amazing Paper Couture 3R online fashion design competition.

Currently undergoing internship at Hatta Dolmat Design Kuala Lumpur, the Diploma in Fashion Design student at MSU's School of Hospitality and Creative Arts (SHCA) had been shortlisted from over 80 contestants nationwide.

He takes home RM800 in cash prize and 5,000 in Petronas Mesra points.

Muhammad Danish's creation embodies life through the use of forestry and roots, inspired by Paris-based Chinese fashion designer Guo Pei who is best known for singer Rihanna's yellow gown at the Met Gala 2015.

His muse once described Guo Pei's work as representing a life force of flowers and roots, and believes gold to embody the best in knowledge and wealth; likening it to the colour of the human soul.

While her use of blue is a nod to l'heure bleu – the French expression for the blue hour in the period of twilight at dawn or dusk – Muhammad Danish's sky shade equally reflects the nature theme of the competition.

Muhammad Danish, who is also a President's List and Dean's List award recipient every semester as well as MSU Fashion Club vice-president, had managed MSU's

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Short courses on writing and communication skills

Curtin Malaysia offers online short courses to help you refine and strengthen your writing skills and improve presentation competency.



CURTIN University Malaysia (Curtin Malaysia) is offering two short online training courses in October and November through its newly established Curtin Malaysia School of Professional Advancement and Continuing Education (CM-SPACE).

The courses are designed for a wide range of participants from tertiary students to working adults who want to enhance specific communication skills.

The first is an English Writing Skills course, which will be delivered via Cisco Webex from Oct 13-16, 2021.

"It is a course that will help you refine and strengthen your writing skills and enable you to express yourself clearly and beautifully.

"It teaches the best practices professionals must know to create effective writing, including emails, letters, and essays," said course trainer Tahiruddin Mian, a language expert

and lecturer at Curtin Malaysia. According to Tahiruddin, participants will learn key aspects of good writing such as building paragraphs, formal writing, transition signals (connecting ideas and adding coherence), summarising (summing up

key points) and paraphrasing. Following this will be a short course on Effective Communications Skills, which will also be delivered by Tahiruddin online via Webex, from Nov 15-20, 2021.

Tahiruddin said the power of one's presentation skills often determines the success or failure of their proposals.

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Nurturing digital-ready grads

DIGITALISATION is transforming every imaginable aspect of our lives and it also changes the way all industries work. Given its impact, this consequently changes the skill sets required in the workplace.

Hence, students from higher learning institutions will have to be well prepared to equip themselves with the latest digital knowledge even during internships.

At least that was what Lim Bing Yi, a Tunku Abdul Rahman University College (TAR UC) Bachelor of Construction Management and Economics (Hons) student was expecting when he prepared for his own internship experience.

Currently interning at Greentech Construction Sdn Bhd, Lim is prepared to face the challenges in the construction industry, namely the transition towards digital processes such as via building information modelling (BIM) software to conduct his field duties ranging from project planning, management, and budget control to realtime navigation of 3D models in the field.

But how important is BIM to this field? "The construction industry nowadays is gradually witnessing many key job roles being enhanced by BIM and planning software.

"For example, key roles like project planning, resource assignment, budget control, informative construction drawing, reviewing, and editing 3D models can be executed via software such as Tekla, Primavera, Microsoft Project, AutoCAD, Navisworks and Revit that make it faster,

more accurate, and more efficient. "With a standardised system like BIM software, information process flow will also be streamlined as everyone will be adapting to the same system, eliminating issues of compatibility and confusion," said Lim.

Lim said TAR UC prepared him well for his internship with exposure to the many BIM software



He also expressed his gratitude that TAR UC has the latest facilities such as the BIM Centre that allows students to familiarise themselves with the latest BIM software used by the construction management industry today.

At Greentech Construction Sdn Bhd, Lim often needs to solve problems on the fly especially during regular site walks. The soft skills he honed from his role

as the secretary of TAR UC Kung Fu Recreational Club came in handy.

"Skills such as time management, critical thinking and problem-solving are essential

to my regular work duties where I need to solve problems on-site and ensure work is progressing smoothly via constant communication between subcontractors and my senior site supervisor.

"This internship has been great, and I am positive the experience will help me as I continue to embark on this lifelong journey," he said.

TAR UC trains students on using BIM software under a comprehensive learning syllabus jointly developed by TAR UC, Trimble Solutions Malaysia, BIM Engineering Solution and Technology, and BSI Services Malaysia.

It is currently one of two institutions of higher learning in Malaysia to be appointed as a Tekla Authorised Training Centre by Trimble Solutions Malaysia.

In addition, TAR UC signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with e-Con-struct Services, a subsidiary of Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB) that paves the way for both parties to share academic knowledge and best industry practices while further facilitating necessary exposure on BIM to TAR UC's student and academic staff.

Educating the next generation of leaders

This certification course is also embedded in the Bachelor of Business (Finance) (Hons) programme which is affiliated with the Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA) Institute – preparing students for their CFA exams.

Furthermore, Bachelor of Business Analytics (Hons) graduates would be awarded with a certificate from SAS Institute – that provides analytics solutions to some 83,000 businesses around the world – upon completion of the programme.

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

Students who undergo internships with us will have the chance to be exposed to Naluri's multidisciplinary collaboration in nutrition care management," said the head dietitian, Eng Seow Wei.

Chua Li Xin, one of IMU's finalyear Dietetics students who recently completed her internship with Livesmart recounted, "I was able to experience the whole process on how digital dietetics can play a part in improving one's diet, physical and mental health. It is not just about helping one lose weight, but also about helping clients take ownership of their overall wellbeing. We often hear how online nutrition counselling is not as effective due to the lack of human touch. However, when done right, nutrition counselling can still impart empathy and respect. I am very excited to see what else is in store for digital dietetics and how it can gain more recognition in Malaysia."

IMU offers the BSc (Hons) Dietetics with Nutrition degree, a four-year programme integrated with dietetics practicums in the area of food service management, community and clinical dietetics, as well as the opportunity to embark upon a mobility experience aboard or locally.

The programme also offers credit transfer options to a bachelor's degree in two Australian universities – University of Newcastle and Griffith University.

Each year, the Dietetics with Nutrition programme will commence in July and September.
