These future doctors will spend the first two and a half years of the degree programme (known as the Pre-Clinical Training phase) in Dublin.

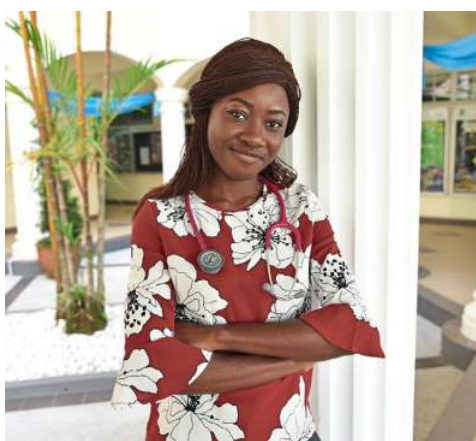

"Socially conscious investors are not focused solely on returns on investment. Instead, they support companies that champion causes and social impact, from the reduction of plastic waste to the modernisation of local fisheries. These companies need to succeed, and with  $\mu$ Pledge, we are moving towards crowd ownership where investors become part of the missions they believe in."

$\mu$ Pledge started as a capstone project when Chong read a fintech programme at Oxford University's Saïd Business School in 2021.

Looking back, Chong credits UCSI for giving him the platform to experience a wide range of activities, a process that honed his soft skills.

At UCSI, precocious students like Chong earn leading credentials that serve as their global passport. The value of their degree is boosted by the university's ever-improving global profile.

UCSI stands out as one of Asia's best private universities in the QS World University Rankings 2024.

A total of 20 UCSI academics are either Fellows of the Academy of Sciences Malaysia or are ranked in Stanford's World's Top 2% Scientists – a list that identifies the most cited scientists in various disciplines around the world.

UCSI recently made history when it became the first university in Malaysia to feature in the *Harvard Data Science Review* (HDSR), which is a top-ranked journal published by MIT Press, a university press affiliated with

the prestigious Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT).

Assistant Prof Dr Mehrbakhsh Nilashi, Prof Dr Ooi Keng Boon and Prof Dr Garry Tan Wei Han were part of a five-man research team that published an insightful paper titled "Critical Data Challenges in Measuring the Performance of Sustainable Development Goals: Solutions and the Role of Big-Data Analytics" in HDSR's Summer 2023 Issue 5.3.

In doing so, Prof Ooi and Prof Tan also made history for being the first Malaysians to publish in the HDSR.

With so much going on, students are encouraged to visit UCSI's Open Days to get a taste of what life is like on campus.

UCSI will be holding Open Days on the weekends of Aug 26 to 27.

Visitors can look forward to campus tours that showcase state-of-the-art 4IR engineering labs, recital halls, architecture galleries and creative art facilities, among others.

Special VIP counselling sessions and career-matching tests will also be held.

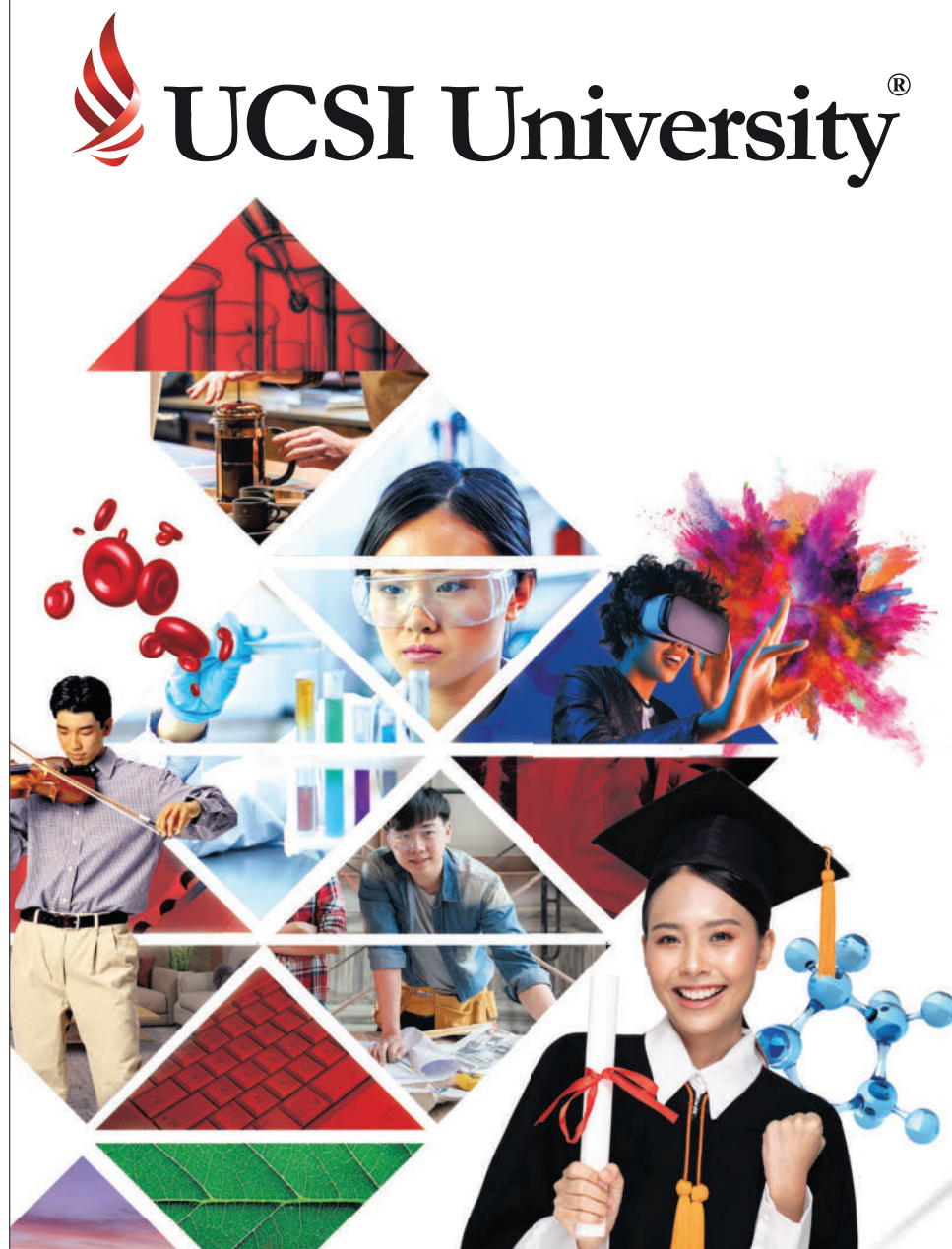

MSU's MBBS programme is also recognised by the India National Medical Commission, Sri Lanka Medical Council, and the Maldives Medical and Dental Council.

In addition, MSU's MBBS curriculum complies with the MMC guidelines and presents a continually expanding level of medical experience.

To ensure students get the maximum knowledge out of their learning, MSU has designed its five-year medical course into two study phases through its

International Medical School (IMS).

In Phase I, also known as the pre-clinical phase (Years 1 and 2), students will be exposed to basic medical sciences through system-based modules.

Phase II, also known as the clinical phase (Years 3, 4 and 5), is conducted through the discipline-based posting that includes Medicine, Surgery, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Paediatric, Psychiatry, Primary Care, Orthopaedics, Emergency Medicine and Short Postings.

Students spend their first and second years learning the fundamentals of medical sciences. In their third year, they acquire fundamental clinical knowledge

and abilities, and in their fourth year, they spend time learning about various medical specialties.

Students learn clinical skills to solidify their degree-level medical education in their final year.

MSU also emphasises clinical communication skills for its MBBS course, which is why the course is designed to give students numerous opportunities to develop their clinical skills through community engagement visits, medical practices, community care facilities and hospitals.

Upon completing their degree, the new doctors must register with the Public Services Department and undergo a two-year housemanship at selected public hospitals while supervised by MOH.

MSU medical students have the privilege of completing their clinical training at two major referral hospitals in Malaysia: Hospital Tengku Ampuan Rahimah in Klang and Hospital Sungai Buloh.

## State-of-the-art facilities

MSU built its own medical centre and became Malaysia's first private university with its own private specialist hospital with up-to-date healthcare services for the public, as well as job opportunities for its medical and health science graduates.

Honouring its tagline, "Caring, Healing, Educating", through

accessible and integrated medical services, the MSU Medical Centre is equipped with 250 beds in 14 levels with six operation theatres, six labour rooms, five intensive-care units and four dental clinics, as well as specialist clinics and day care facilities.

## Become a well-rounded doctor

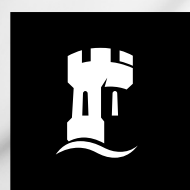
At MSU, students study medical courses at a top-tier institution, shadowing top researchers and practitioners across various specialties and acquiring invaluable well-rounded experiences.

Armed with a medical degree from MSU, you're guaranteed a job upon graduation, and most importantly, you'll have the essential vital skill sets that would allow you to help save people's lives.

Intakes for the MBBS programme are in April and October. Qualified students are required to sit for the Medical Entry Test at the MSU campus in Shah Alam to determine their aptitude for the programme.

Alternatively, MSU's Foundation in Science Biology/Health Science offers a fast-track pre-university programme that prepares students for entry into the MBBS programme.
