## Fostering unity and togetherness

MALAYSIANS are grateful for the blessings they enjoy, but they must not allow themselves to become complacent, advised Tuanku Muhriz Tuanku Munawir recently.

The Yang di-Pertuan Besar of Negri Sembilan, who celebrates his 76th birthday today, also reminded Malaysians of the importance of upholding the principles of the Rukun Negara, the foundation for national unity.

The Ruler's message to Malaysians to unite for a better Malaysia is more apt than ever, particularly at a time when world news seems to be headlined by conflict.

Reflecting on recent world events, the Ruler repeated this call in his opening address at the Negri Sembilan Bar Committee dinner and dance held last November.

"When we look at the conflicts that occur around the world today, we get dismayed at all the injustice that is perpetrated.

"There are nations whose authorities neglect the development of their own countries, causing widespread poverty, or practise gross discrimination between their citizens on the basis of religion, race or culture," he said.

While they appreciated the nation's blessings, the Ruler urged citizens not to rest on their laurels and instead, to work on improving their understanding and practice of the Rukun Negara, which is integral to the Malaysian identity.

"The good news is that here in Malaysia, we are grateful for all the blessings we enjoy. But we must not be complacent, resting on our laurels.

"Instead, we must safeguard what we have and also work towards improving on practising the values we uphold.

"Simply put, the essential values are a responsible society and good governance. If properly practised, the Rukun Negara can achieve these goals," he said.

In times of crisis or on happy occasions, whether offering words of comfort to flood victims or enjoying cultural performances at the state's Deepavali Open House, the Ruler does not shy away from lending his support to the people.

To foster the spirit of togetherness, the Ruler encourages greater interaction between people of different cultures and religious beliefs.

As someone who truly believes in practising the values set out by the Rukun Negara, Tuanku Muhriz exemplifies what it means to embrace the principle of mutual respect and good social behaviour – the fifth pillar embodied in the Rukun Negara.

"Greater interaction will result in an appreciation of the values upheld by cultures different from your own.

"In this way, one is not merely encouraged to be tolerant of others, but to have a greater respect for the ways and culture of others," he said.

While acknowledging the

numerous calls to revive the observance of the Rukun Negara's principles, Tuanku Muhriz said merely reciting it was not enough.

"The Rukun Negara was formulated in 1970, and yet, it is not appreciated by many.

"It is not enough to be able to memorise and recite the Rukun Negara in the early years of school, only to forget it as one grows up.

"It is also not enough to have a recitation at functions by youths. If we are serious about observing its principles, recitations must be led by leaders," he said, citing Negri Sembilan's Mentri Besarled recitation of the Rukun Negara on National Day as one good example.

The Ruler, a firm believer in the power of education, suggested that the teaching of the Rukun Negara could be done at several levels beginning with the basics in primary school.

The teaching of the Rukun Negara at different levels of understanding in schools is imperative to mould citizens with a strong sense of responsihility

"At secondary school, there can be classes to explain the objectives of the principles. At a higher level still, there can be discussions to encourage a deeper understanding," said Tuanku Muhriz, who is also Chancellor of Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia

Since ascending the throne in 2009, the Ruler has reiterated that national unity and the spirit of togetherness are pivotal for the nation's continued peace and harmony.

At the Negri Sembilan Bar Committee event, he reminded guests of the motto emblazoned on Malaysia's Coat of Arms – "Bersekutu Bertambah Mutu" or

Unity is Strength.

"I expect you remember the motto of your alma mater, but the country's motto is never mentioned and is forgotten.

"It is Bersekutu Bertambah Mutu, Unity is Strength, and sits very well with the Rukun Negara," he said imploring that the motto be used more frequently in correspondence and speeches.

Having inculcated the values of righteousness and integrity as a young law student at the University of Wales, Aberystwyth (now Aberystwyth University), the Ruler espouses doing the right thing, particularly in the face of injustice.

Tuankú Muhriz, who graduated with an LLB (Hons) in 1970, credits the concepts he learned at university for imbuing in him an unwavering sense of integrity.

These principles of justice and fair play are the background for


the Ruler's approach towards his subjects and the many causes he champions.

Having served the community in various capacities including as a member of the Rotary Club of Kuala Lumpur DiRaja in his younger years, the Ruler always prioritises selfless service.

Tuanku Muhriz's untiring efforts to ensure people from all walks of life have equal access to quality healthcare, for example, was recognised with an Honorary Fellowship from the Royal College of Surgeons Edinburgh (RCSEd).

The honour, which is the prestigious institution's highest award, was presented to Tuanku Muhriz in appreciation of his efforts to support healthcare in aid of impoverished communities in Malaysia and the advancement of surgery.

Another award, the Tuanku Muhriz Travelling Fellowship in Rural Surgery, a collaboration between RCSEd and UKM, was also named in his honour.

At the opening of the UCSI Hospital in Bandar Springhill near Port Dickson in November, Tuanku Muhriz spoke about how the provision of high-quality medical care had the potential to change the healthcare landscape in Negri Sembilan.

"The availability of high-quality medical care and sufficient specialists as well as doctors offers more medical care and treatment options for the people of Port Dickson and Negri Sembilan.

"UCSI Hospital is part of UCSI Health Metropolis, a mega project planned to make Bandar Springhill a hub for medical tourism and education. This multi-facility project includes accommodation, a convention centre, a shopping complex, sports facilities, a research lab and more," he said.

elected representatives hold to
the same standard of putting the
people first. To the Ruler, duty
and service are foremost.

During the state investiture ceremony to mark his last birthday, Tuanku Muhriz had said that leaders who had been given the mandate by the people must possess sincerity to serve and put the country's interests above their own.

"Although there are differences in ideologies and agendas among us, I am sure that there are similarities, especially in the agenda for development and the people's welfare to establish a more prosperous country."

This sentiment was repeated in October during the opening of the state assembly when the Ruler congratulated newly elected representatives and commended the formation of a new collaborative state government working towards a common aim – continued progress for the state.

In line with his views that elected representatives should always set any differences aside for the benefit of the rakyat, Tuanku Muhriz stressed that duties given to the people's

representatives must be carried out with full integrity and accountability, prioritising the interests of the state without any political or personal agendas.

Tuanku Muhriz said that politicians must be sensitive to the wishes and views of people who voice their sentiments via various spaces and platforms.

"Know that you are always being watched and judged by the people, so debate and argue rationally and intellectually on matters that can bring good and mutual benefit by complying with the rules of the House throughout the sitting.

"I wish to remind honourable house members to always appreciate, protect, preserve, and defend the Federal Constitution and the Constitution of the State of Negri Sembilan," he said.

Tuanku Muhriz also applauded the state administration for successfully steering Negri Sembilan through economic uncertainties and challenges brought on by the Covid-19 pandemic, saying it was due to its commitment and cooperation in working together effectively that helped the state remain a preferred destination

for investors.

However, Tuanku Muhriz said, while the state recorded good financial performance, it was imperative that issues such as the cost of living, job opportunities and income disparity between urban and rural areas also be addressed.

In his speech, the Ruler out-

lined initiatives implemented by the state government to ensure that the people had access to a sufficient food supply and that they would not be burdened by the higher cost of living or goods.

"These economic empowerment programmes include the development of unused land, business capital assistance, halal cottage industry certification, fishing equipment assistance for coastal fishermen, monthly living assistance for university students and the provision of Rumah Harapan subsidies.

"The state government also launched the Jualan Harga Ladang Negri Sembilan Prihatin initiative to combat supply issues and the rising prices of essential items. Through the programme, the people can purchase essential goods 20 to 30% cheaper than the market price," he said.

The Ruler expressed hope that socio-economic development efforts that include the state's economic empowerment agenda, digitalisation and the adoption of new technology, entrepreneurship and human capital development, would be intensified to boost the state's economic growth.

If there is one thing that the people of Negri Sembilan know, it is that they have their Ruler in their corner.

Tuanku Muhriz's love of state and country and his commitment to put people first endear him to his subjects as an approachable

### Honouring heritage and traditions

FAMED for its Adat Perpatih (customary laws), Negri Sembilan has a wealth of fascinating traditions. Among them is the Istiadat Ulangan Penghulu Luak Tanah Mengandung Mengadap Menjunjung Duli, a ceremony steeped in heritage and history. Typically held triennially, the ceremony dates back to 1898 during the reign of Tuanku Muhammad Tuanku Antah, the great-grandfather of the present Yang di-Pertuan Besar of Negri Sembilan, Tuanku Muhriz Tuanku Munawir.

Locals and foreign visitors were fortu-

nate enough to witness a slice of history during the most recent edition of the event which was held from Nov 17 to 19.

A spectacular showcase of pomp and grandeur, the three-day event commemorated the state's unique traditions, passed down through generations.

In the weeks leading up to the event, the

In the weeks leading up to the event, the royal town of Seri Menanti was bedecked in state colours.

Yellow, red, and black pennants billowed along the town's streets, setting the stage for the time-honoured event.

The atmosphere in the charming town was festive throughout the period, underscoring an event of great historical importance

The Istiadat Ulangan Penghulu Luak Tanah Mengandung Mengadap Menjunjung Duli reaffirms an-over-acentury-old pledge of allegiance by the penghulu (chieftains) of several luak (districts) to the state Ruler.

This show of loyalty originates from the union of the different luak under one Ruler – the Yang di Pertuan Besar or Yamtuan.

Based on historical sources, Negri Sembilan was founded as a sovereign entity in 1773 by Raja Melewar, a member of the Pagar Ruyong royal family in Sumatra who was invited by local chieftains to become the first Yang di-Pertuan Besar of Negri Sembilan, a federation of nine "states".

In the intervening decades, turmoil including a British incursion and the annexation of Naning to Melaka, resulted in an unstable political climate.

Given shared economic and political interests, an agreement was made in 1885 to reconstitute the federation of Negri Sembilan.

This ultimately led to the Istiadat Ulangan Penghulu Luak Tanah Mengandung Mengadap Menjunjung Duli, an affirmation of allegiance that ensured continued peace and prosperity for the

In true Negri Sembilan tradition, the main event was heralded by two days of festivities entrenched in age-old customs.

The highlight of day one was Istiadat Menurun dan Memasang Alat Kebesaran, the emplacement of the royal regalia in the forecourt of Istana Besar Seri Menanti.

Day two unfolded with Istiadat Bersiram, the royal bathing ceremony.

Before the ceremony could begin, Tuanku Muhriz and his consort Tunku Ampuan Besar Negri Sembilan Tuanku Aishah Rohani Tengku Besar Mahmud were transported to Panca Persada, the ceremonial dais, in a special royal carriage called Takhta Rencana.

The procession was led by musicians who sang praises of Prophet Muhammad accompanied by the rhythmic beating of century-old gongs punctuated with the booms of cannon fire.

The carriage, pulled by smartly uniformed Pegawai 99 or ceremonial guard, was a sight to behold.

Once the royal couple had disembarked and were seated on the dais, they were

presented with cepu bedak limau or lime water by the Orang Empat Istana (four senior palace officials) for a symbolic cleansing ritual. After the ceremony, the crowd was treated to traditional dance performances.

The much-awaited main event took place at the palace's Balairong Seri on day three, when the penghulu luak, elected following the matrilineal clan system, declared their allegiance to Tuanku Muhriz, as their forebears once did to former state Rulers.

The penghulu luak who pledged their allegiance were from Luak Ulu Muar, Luak Jempol, Luak Terachi, Luak Gunung Pasir and Luak Ineh. The event was even more special as 2023 marked the 250th year of the state monarchy.

In his address, Tuanku Muhriz said since its institution in 1898, the ceremony mirrored the loyalty and allegiance of the penghulu luak under the patronage of the Yang di-Pertuan Besar Negri Sembilan in line with the phrase "Alam yang berajo, luak yang berpenghulu".

Translated, the phrase means that there is a Ruler for every place, country or region.

The Ruler said that detailed research was currently underway to document facts related to the establishment of the Negri Sembilan monarchy. This research aims to give a more accurate picture of the state's history by focusing only on documented evidence.

"It is important to know the right history as history connects us to the past and guides our future.

"The accurate recording and documenting of facts is a discipline that has to be practised by all parties particularly the authorities, academic institutions and historians," Tuanku Muhriz said.

An advocate for justice, Tuanku Muhriz also decried the tweaking of historical facts, saying such acts went against educational and intellectual ethics as they denied future generations the truth.

"A complete record of the history of monarchy in the state is imperative to defend the state's sovereignty, particularly in identifying the boundaries of power.

"Through the monarchy, the Yang di Pertuan Besar plays a vital role in uniting every district in the state of Negri Sembilan," Tuanku Muhriz said, adding that he hoped the research findings would serve as a resource to the state administration and the public to maintain the state's sovereignty and the harmony of its multi-racial population.

### A philanthropic royal family

TUANKU Muhriz Tuanku Munawir was born on this day in 1948, in the royal town of Seri Menanti and is the only son of Tuanku Munawir Tuanku Abdul Rahman, the ninth Yang di-Pertuan Besar of Negri Sembilan, and his consort Tuanku Durah Tunku Besar Burhanuddin. The 11th Yang di-Pertuan Besar of Negri Sembilan is also the grandson of the country's first Yang di-Pertuan Agong Tuanku Abdul Rahman Tuanku Muhammad.

The Ruler was raised in Negri Sembilan, where he attended the Tuanku Muhammad School in Kuala Pilah, Tunku Besar School in Tampin and later King George V Secondary School in Seremban.

When Tuanku Muhriz was just 12 years old, the young prince was made Tunku Laxamana, second in rank among the Putera Yang Empat or four senior princes. Just a year later, he was bestowed the title of Tunku Besar Seri Menanti, the most senior rank among the four princes, a role he assumed until his ascension to the throne as Yang di-Pertuan Besar of Negri Sembilan on Oct 26, 2009.

As a teenager, Tuanku Muhriz attended England's prestigious Aldenham School, where he completed his O- and A-Levels.

It was at the school that the young prince explored his love for music, picking up the guitar and fronting a band called The Prince and the Paupers.

After Aldenham, the Ruler continued his tertiary education at the University of Wales at Aberystwyth (now Aberystwyth University) where he studied law and was a keen sportsman.

Armed with an LLB (Hons) from the university, Tuanku Muhriz returned to Malaysia and launched a career in the corporate world with stints in banking, finance and advertising.

Looking back on his university years, Tuanku Muhriz has said that Aberystwyth University played an important role in shaping his character and instilling in him values that he still holds dear today.

These values include a high standard for legal principles, natural justice, and the impor-

tance of doing what is proper. Tuanku Muhriz was conferred an Honorary Fellowship by Aberystwyth University in 2014 for his contributions to the public and private sectors, as well as his tireless charitable initiatives.

On April 25, 1974, Tuanku Muhriz married Tuanku Aishah Rohani Tengku Besar Mahmud. The couple were blessed with three princes – Tunku Ali Redhauddin born in 1977, Tunku Zain Al-'Abidin born in 1982, and the youngest, Tunku Alif Hussein Saifuddin Al-Amin who was born

The close-knit royal family was devastated when Tunku Alif. who was born with special needs, breathed his last on Jan 15, 2016.

Through their various roles and charity work, the royal couple and the princes continue to serve the needs of the underprivileged including at-risk children and people with disabilities.

As Chancellor of Universiti Islam Malaysia (USIM), Tuanku Aishah has helped transform the tertiary institution into a preferred choice for further studies, particularly among foreign students.

Tunku Ali who is the current Tunku Besar Seri Menanti, completed his GCSE and A-Levels at Marlborough College in Wiltshire, England and later

attended Cambridge University where he read History and Social and Political Science.

The prince also has a Master in Public Administration from Harvard Kennedy School, the public policy and public administration school of the prestigious Harvard University in the US.

Tunku Ali, like his parents, is passionate about education and serves as Pro-Chancellor of USIM and Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM).

Tunku Ali is also the founding trustee of non-profit Teach for Malaysia. A senior advisor to global equity firm TPG Capital, the prince also sits on various boards including Malaysian satellite television and IPTV provider Astro and wildlife NGO WWF-Malaysia.

Among the causes close to Tunku Ali's heart is Yayasan Munarah, one of the first charitable initiatives undertaken by the Negri Sembilan royal family after Tuanku Muhriz ascended the

As chairman of Yayasan Munarah's board of trustees, Tunku Ali ensures that less privileged and deserving members of the community, particularly students, receive financial assistance to pursue their dreams regardless of race or religion.

His younger brother, Tunku Zain, was also educated at

Marlborough College. The prince Sociology and Government, and an MSc in Comparative Politics from the London School of Economics and Political Science.

The prince is a keen pianist and the patron of Euroasia Association of Performing Arts, which is dedicated to the education, development and promotion of the performing arts in Malaysia.

The founding president of the Institute for Democracy and Economic Affairs (IDEÁS), the prince sits on the board of various corporations and non-profits including IDEAS Autism Centre,

which focuses on early intervention, care and therapy for children with autism from low-income families.

Tunku Zain is a trustee of Yayasan Munarah, Yayasan Chow Kit and the Jeffrey Cheah Foundation, as well as the Pro-Chancellor of UCSI University and a Royal Fellow of Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia. He is also a newspaper columnist.

As president of the Negri Sembilan Squash Association, the prince has contributed to the development of the state's sporting talent and continues to support next-generation squash champions.
